We have been thinking about food this week, especially after reading the story 'Daisy eat your peas' by Kes Gray and Nick Sharratt. We spoke about our favourite meals and decided to make them using





craft materials. We then wrote a menu for them using descriptive language. They all sounded so delicious! Whilst focussing on food the children learnt about the different food groups and what it means to have a healthy and varied diet to make us grow big and strong. We also discovered how important it is to drink water and that our bodies are made up of 60% water! That's over half! We all agreed that eating fruits and vegetables is really healthy for us and remembered that we must try to eat 5 portions a day!
