

Use tally marks to record the colours of the cars you see.



## Foundation Stage News



The Nursery children love to paint, glue, build and experiment with colour, shapes and textures. So this week our creativity has been flowing. We have made a 'Very Hungry Caterpillar' display and used our cutting, sticking and designing skills to make insects that can crawl around our castle role-play.

Our book this week has been another favourite by Eric Carle 'The Very Busy Spider'. We looked at how a clever spider makes a web and made our own webs with glitter and glue. Then we

wondered 'If I were a spider...?' we would not want to be black or brown but all sorts of colours. The children have been very creative choosing their colours as they cut around the circles that they drew for bodies and counted 8 legs to stick on carefully.

We decided our role-play castle had one thing missing, a dragon! The children have used boxes to build into a 3 dimensional dragon and made the hot fire with orange, yellow and red stuck together to form a magnificent effect.

We have had great fun practising for the school play. Thank you for sending your child's costume into school. Please remember we would like all costumes in named bags in school by next Wednesday. Thank You.



The Reception children will soon be expert transport designers and traffic engineers. They made fabulous pictograms using the data they had collected from last week's traffic survey focussing on different coloured cars. The children could interpret their pictograms and answer lots of questions. The children had some very imaginative ideas about all the things they might see out of a car window when travelling anywhere in the world. The children thought they might see 'horses', 'the sea', 'mountains', 'buildings' 'sand', 'police helicopters', 'trees' and 'me in the mirror'!

Of course the highlight of the transport theme this week was the trip in a coach to the magnificent Brooklands Transport Museum where they looked at cars, fast and slow, planes and bicycles new and old. What a wonderful treat!
