

#### **Foundation Stage News**

After a great firework week the celebrations have continued in Reception as they have been learning about Diwali. Diwali was on the 24<sup>th</sup> October this year and the Reception children decided to have fun celebrating this traditional Hindu festival. First they watched a film with shadow puppets acting out the story. Can your child remember the name of the characters? They drew lovely Mehndi patterns on hand templates, Diwali cards and made Diva lamps out of salt dough. The children coloured, cut out and threaded lotus flowers to make garlands and wove paper using alternating colours to make carpets for the lovely Diwali displays in the class rooms.



As Diwali is the festival of light the Reception science topic has

been to explore light and dark. The children have had great fun investigating the **Dark House** in the role play area using torches and reflective objects.

The children are working very hard in maths. This week they tried counting two groups of objects to find out how many altogether. Some children have been learning to use number-lines for their addition.

The group challenge was also on a topical theme as the children worked in groups to make giant poppies. The children also watched a film to help them to understand a little about Remembrance Day.

The Nursery children have been busy making props, learning their lines and practising songs for their assembly on Friday. We are so proud of them all and love their singing.



In Nursery we have carried on investigating foods that are healthy for us. We are not fussy like Oliver in our story 'Oliver's Fruit Salad' by Vivian French. Our maths activity has been to read the number of vegetables that are needed for our vegetable soup and then counting out the correct number of vegetables to go in the pot. In the garden we have had some very good teachers and hardworking pupils in our role play school. When the weather has allowed, some children have been working their healthy bodies on the trim trail. We have also been
