Foundation Stage News

In Nursery we have had great fun this week learning about planes and flying. We have been finding out about pilots, propellers, runways, passengers and lots more. Our role play in the cottage outside is all about air travel and the cottage is being transformed into an airport. The children are learning to write and buy tickets, enjoy a meal at the airport café and do some shopping before checking their departure written on the departure board by the children. The team then report to the runway for take off.

There are opportunities to learn about all sorts of transport around the Nursery. In the Red Room role play the children have enjoyed setting up a railway station. There has been some careful driving around the roads and buildings in the construction area. Boxes are being transformed into buses with painting and sticking in the art room. Well done to all the children, they have been working very hard writing their names this week.

The highlight of the week has been a visitor to Nursery and the Reception Classes a *real* member of a leading airline's cabin crew. She told us all about the jobs she does on each flight. The children learn so much from direct experiences and the opportunity to ask questions.



Reception have been looking at the story 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt'. They have acted out the story and then used small world equipment, toys and props, to recreate the story and they have also made Bear Hunt maps.

They have been thinking about what they pass on the way to school and making their own maps. The 'Bebot' programmable bug has been turned into a bear who has been directed to travel on his own hunt around the children's maps. They have been making sandwiches or toast to take on their 'Bear Hunt' and practised their spreading skills, so please continue to practise at home. The children are working at the difficult skill of estimating. Can you practise picking up a handful of objects, estimating how many and then counting. Make it a game so that the whole family can play and discover who has the most objects.

Now the weather is colder the children wear their jogging trousers over shorts or skirts at playtime. They will occasionally wear them home but they do need their full school uniform and PE kit in school every day. Thank You.
