What a chilly week this has been. Hats, mittens, long trousers have all been needed and not just by the children! It was fun breaking up the ice in the garden, feeling how cold it was and then watching it melt when we brought it inside. We have been very creative this week and some of the children have helped to create a large 'chocolcate factory' which has more and more things added to it every day. We have been painting, gluing, taping, glittering and cutting to name a few. Fine motor skills have been our focus this week, with the children using tweezers, tongs and scoops to pick up small fruit and gems from the porridge oats.
