The children were introduced to the story Funny Bones by Janet and Allan Ahlberg as part of their topic, 'We like to move it move it'. They thoroughly enjoyed listening to, singing along to and dancing along to The Skeleton Song. Can your child tell you which bones are connected to each other?



Neptune and Mars started off their week creating a class skeleton! They labelled all of the bones that they knew, and made some sensible estimations as to how many bones they thought the human body has. They could not believe the actual answer for it was a much bigger number than most of their guesses! Following on from this, the children designed and decorated their own Funny Bones cardboard houses. They discovered that down a street, one side of the houses are odd and the other side is even. The children listened to and joined in with a 'counting in twos' song. They then decided which number they would give their front door and had to place their house down the odd or even side of the class street! Please encourage them to look at numbers in their environment and decide whether that number is odd or even. Reception are feeling rather



proud of themselves and are becoming quite the experts at practising cursive handwriting. This week's letters are g and q! Don't forget, these letters go under the line and look rather curly! Great job everyone for another spectacular week!
