Foundation Stage News

The children in the Foundation Stage had a very special treat on Wednesday joining in with some wonderful tales presented by our visiting story teller, Vanessa. She told each group a variety of stories including the tale of the fisherman who caught a little bottle with a Genie, the Gingerbread Man and the man who found a fish in his cup. The stories certainly fired our imaginations for after the story session one Nursery child told the staff all about an enormous wolf she could see in the garden!





There has been lots of talk about stories and rhymes as the Nursery children have been playing 'I Spy' looking for characters from the book 'Each Peach Pear Plum' by Janet and Allan Ahlberg. The characters have also been hiding in the garden and the children have used their observational skills and geographical knowledge of the garden to look at picture clues to help them find the places in the garden where the characters are hiding.

Each child in the Foundation Stage has been taking special care using their fine motor skills and creativity to make some surprises for mothers on Sunday.

The rhyme that the Reception children have been thinking about has been Mary, Mary. Their activities have included labelling the parts of a plant and making daffodils linking their ideas to the Art Focus painting, 'Work' by Ford Madox Brown. The children have started a science experiment by placing trays of cress seeds in various parts of the classroom to discover which conditions will help the seeds grow best.

The children have written letters to Mary, Mary giving her advice about how to grow her plants tall and strong. The children hope Mary will write back soon. The maths activity this week has been to solve problems about lots of different rhymes that the children have learnt this term.
