*Dear Parents*

*On Friday we were all delighted to see the return of the Class Assemblies this week featuring the children from Mercury Class. They talked about weather in a very topical manner addressing the rainfall and the regional floods and gave a beautifully illustrated demonstration of how much rain falls in Britain using metre sticks and some film footage. The clever children then performed a poem about King Canute which was delivered superbly with humour, costume and props. Well done Mercury and a special thank you to Mrs Garrod for this wonderful assembly.*

*On Monday Susannah Lea from Epsom and Ewell Borough Council came to talk to the children in her capacity as Waste Services Assistant. She talked to the children about recycling. She then introduced a competition to design an anti-litter poster and will be returning to judge and present the prize*

*On Tuesday we heard the story of The Lorax, the personal favourite book of the author, Dr Seuss written in 1971. He once explained that the book came out of being angry about environmental issues. Do read it and share it again with your child. We also looked at the enormous pile of paper handtowels collected from the cloakrooms on Monday night and vowed to reduce the amount of paper towels that we use each day. We compared the amount that we had used on Wednesday morning and found a significant reduction. The other significant reduction that we found this week was with our energy consumption. Year 2 read our gas and electricity meters on Monday and Tuesday morning and afternoon and, following a day of energy conservation found an impressive difference. The House challenge on Tuesday was great fun and every child in the school worked together in their Houses to create some stunning House motifs. We have enjoyed producing our 'EXTRA' sheet containing many of the Environment challenges too numerous to mention here. Well done everyone and a special thank you to Mrs Alison Kay for coordinating such a memorable event.*



## Foundation Stage News

In Nursery our book has been the Aesop fable about 'The North Wind and the Sun' which has led us to think a lot about the wind. We wondered what colour is the wind? And how do we know that it is windy? In the outdoor classroom the children have been listening to music that sounds like the wind and dancing with ribbons like the wind. In the art room the children have been rolling paper to make 'sticks' and fixing streamers onto them, then they have been going outside to test how the streamers blow in the wind. Outside the children have enjoyed playing with our beautiful new shop. They looked in the big wooden box and talked about what we should have inside, the suggestions included toys, ice cream and a hippopotamus! We have chosen **sand** and ordered some which should arrive next week which we hope the children will approve of. The children are busy learning the Nursery highway-code as they drive their bikes along our lovely new road.

Indoors we are learning how to use a ruler to draw lines on paper to make kites and flags.



The children are practising their cutting skills as they cut out kites, flags and balloons to float off in the wind. Learning to use scissors successfully is very hard. Please help at home by giving your child suitable children's scissors and lots of opportunities to practise. The Reception children have been learning how to look after the environment. They have been planting herb and vegetable seeds and wondered if Mrs. Stubbs would like to use some of their produce. Each child wrote to Mrs. Stubbs asking if she would like to use the herbs in the kitchen and what dishes she might make with them.

In Maths they have been practising the number bonds to 10 and some children have been working with the bonds of even higher numbers. The children put red and blue scales on their finger painted fish to work out the number bonds and then they wrote the number sentence.

The children know lots about looking after the local environment and how to look after the creatures in the sea. They made posters to show how they are going to look after the planet, starting with putting the rubbish in the right bins.
