Nursery and Pre-Reception News





Mr Wolf and his pancakes have been taking over the Nursery this week. The first step involved the children writing a shopping list of all the ingredients that Mr Wolf would need to make his pancakes. Second step was to

go to the garden shop and buy the right food. Next

they had to follow the recipe from Mr Wolf's recipe book to make delicious blueberry pancakes, and finally it was time to eat them all up, yummy! We have read this book many times this week and the children have helped to act out the story and join in with the repeated phrases. We have also read Rosie's Walk this week, all about Rosie's stroll around her farm, where unbeknown to her, a hungry fox is following her. The book uses lots of positional language and we have used the vocabulary on the trim trail, where we went around, through and over all the different aparatus. Our sound of the week is 'g', we can really see the improvement the children have made when hearing the different initial sounds in words. We undertook a big Numicon investigation this week. Numicon is a resource which the children can use to help them learn about quantities of number. They went on a Numicon hunt around the garden and bought some pets from the pet shop by working out how much Numicon they cost. We enjoyed play dough fun, printing, pattern making, sorting using tweezers as well as extra large Numicon to explore outside in the garden.

RECEPTION Wow! What an amazing week in Reception. On Tuesday we had a wonderful visit to Bockett's Farm; the children met a range of animals and learnt many new facts. We particularly enjoyed watching Greta the goat being milked! The children were very brave; they had an opportunity to stroke a rabbit called Smudge, two guinea pigs and a mouse in the small animal petting area. On our very bumpy tractor ride we saw many lambs, alpacas, horses and some huge pigs. The children had an action-packed day at the farm including spending time in the soft play area and outside play area! Back in school the children have been writing about their favourite parts of the day. They were able to remember many of

the interesting facts including why the sheep have different colour marks on their wool and the real names of a mummy, daddy and baby goat. As part of our maths learning we have been creating bar charts of the different information collected from our farm visit, some children decided to find out which was the most popular animal, others wanted to find out the most popular part of the day. Such an exciting week!
