This week has been 'Art 'Week'. We have been like busy elves, making lots of different things for Christmas! I know, you can hardly believe it can you? The children have been making some beautiful finger print trees. The colours they have chosen are just lovely. We have blossom trees, autumn trees and ones in the height of summer and you will be seeing these yourselves in the near future. 
