Here we are in February which for centuries was declared as the start of spring! According to the Venerable Bede, an 8th Century Monk and Scholar, winter began on November 7th and officially ended on February 6th. St Bede also confirmed that the Saxon word for the month of February, namely Solomonath, translates as 'Cake Month'. This is one of my favourite facts that I share with the children, or rather shared with the children in the blissful olden days of assemblies in the Hall together.

By talking to adults they can alert us to the way that they have interpreted these uncertainties and we can help to place their concerns in proportion and alleviate stress.

Nursery have also been exploring Mental Health Awareness whilst discussing 'emotion faces' and creating friendship bracelets. The bracelets were lovingly made with care by the children and then given to a friend of choice (some, who had become quite attached to their own creation found this more difficult than others!) Cakes were also in evidence as the children made beautiful Fairy Cakes in the kitchen whilst learning the Nursery Rhyme 'Pat-a-cake, Pat-a-cake.' The theme of Nursery Rhymes has been a joy to explore with boats being made and enjoyed to 'Row, Row, Row your Boat' and delightful buses created whilst singing 'The Wheels on the Bus'.
