Foundation Stage News

We hope everyone had a wonderful half term break. This may be the time of year for dark evenings and winter woollies but the Reception classes offer great cheer and say 'Let's Party' as they start their new topic. They will be learning about a variety of celebrations and begin with a 'bang' with a focus on fireworks. They were very excited to watch some wonderful firework displays on the 'Smart Board' from all around the world. Following this colourful inspiration they have been busy using chalk, pastels, paint and glue to make a variety of beautiful firework pictures. As they worked the children have

explored using a range of tools to create lots of different effects. It was great fun to make a classroom frieze by spraying paint using water sprayers. Next the children used their phonic knowledge to write lots of firework sounds such as 'bang', pop', 'boom' and 'fizz'.

The Nursery topic is continuing with 'People I know and Places I go'. This week the place we have been thinking of going to is a spectacular firework display.



We have been making colourful firework pictures. We have been learning to read the pictures for clues as well as the words for firework noises. Some of the children are trying to write firework words too!

The important person we have been learning about this week is the role of the doctor



and we were very lucky on Tuesday when Mrs. Watkin came to Nursery to talk about being a real doctor in a real hospital. Caitlin and Konstantina dressed up and scrubbed in ready to help. Children learn so much from talking and asking questions we are always pleased to have visitors. Some of the children 'wrote' letters to Mrs. Watkin thanking her for coming. Do let us know if you have a special role (outside

the magnificent role of being a parent) that you could come and talk about to a lively but rewarding audience!

The children have great fun in the hospital role play but we have spent some time thinking about staying healthy. Can your child remember what food they can eat to stay healthy, maybe they can tell you about exercise, sleeping and why and how we keep clean.
