# **Nursery and Pre-Reception News**



What an exciting week we have had in Nursery. This week we have begun our journey through the jungle. The children have been learning about different animals that they might find in the jungle. As explorers they have been thinking about different items they might need to pack for their adventure. As we have learnt that it is very wet and warm in the jungle the children decided that we would need a sun hat, sun cream, a rain coat and lots of food. They then created their own back-

packs with some personal items too remembering of course, that we need our cuddly toys. We have been a bit worried about some of our jungle animals as they have seemed poorly; luckily we have a Jungle Animal Hospital where our vets jumped into action and helped our poorly animals. It's a busy job being a jungle animal vet as some of the animals are tricky to weigh and measure but no job is too tricky for the nursery children. They were able to measure the animals using a range



of resources to find the biggest and the smallest. Outside the jungle expedition continued with the children investigating animal tracks and hunting for animals in the garden; they were very careful as they crossed the crocodile infested water and the snakes hanging from the trees. In the kitchen this week the children have been making their very own 'Vegetable Jungles'. We have been using our knife skills to slice the vegetables and made a bean dip. ### **Reception News**

Reception have had a wonderful week, exploring feelings and emotions in a variety of ways! The children started off with a game of 'How am I?'. They worked together to guess the emotion on someone's face. The children had to come up with a list of many different words to describe the given feelings! Some of our favourite 'feeling words' were delighted, terrified, nervous, and relaxed! Following on from our superb writing and with brains full of wonderful words, to conclude our Huge Bag of Worries work, the children then created their own 'emoji' biscuit





faces! Mars and Neptune classes are perhaps the inventors of some awesome new emojis! In Mathematics, the children focused on understanding and explaining the real value of a number. Ask your children, 'What is 5? What is 10?' The children used a variety of manipulatives to show and tell the value of a number. Reception absolutely loved their first Art class with Mrs Degg, since returning to school! The children were introduced to their new artist, Sayed Haider Raza and explored the bright, abstract creations with their hidden deeper meanings! The children have been left eager and excited to create their clay tile over the next few weeks!
