We have had a wonderful week in Nursery where we have been learning all about our emotions. Our focus book is 'The Colour Monster'. The children have been helping the monster to sort out his muddled emotions into jars. We have been thinking about which colour matches how we are feeling, we have found out that a yellow monster is happy and a blue monster is sad. The Nursery children were super at remembering the



colours, maybe they could help you to find out what colour the scared, calm, angry and loved monsters are? We have been creating our very own colour monsters from playdough and hand printing. We have been thinking about activities that match different emotions, eating chocolate



made us think of the yellow happy monster and big hairy spiders made us think of the grey scared monster. In the kitchen we have been using our new knife skills to cut a range of vegetables to create some cream crackers faces and they were delicious. We have impressed the Nursery teachers this week with our 2D shapes knowledge for we have been naming the shapes as we created some fabulous shape monsters. Wow Nursery you have worked so hard this week!



This week we have continued to have fun exploring 'There's an Alien in your Book' by Tom Fletcher. It seems that when the spaceship crash landed it left behind a lot of 'space junk'! We found out that some of it was magnetic and sorted magnetic and non-magnetic materials. We noticed that the magnetic materials were 'metal things' and had fun seeing how much we could fit onto the magnets.



We learnt how to write in speech bubbles so that we know what the Alien is saying. We tried hard to use our phonics to help us write some sentences and found out what the Alien might say if he is happy, sad or scared.

Mrs Degg introduced the Autumn Term art focus and we began work exploring the Artist Katsushika Hokusai by making a great wave out of clay. We have been balling, blocking rolling, cutting with a clay pin

and curling the clay into the shape of a wave. We can't wait to see what it looks like once it has been in the kiln!

On Thursday we were incredibly lucky to have a visit from a 'Space Dome' where we found out lots of fun information and facts about space and light. We felt as if we had zoomed all the way up to the moon and enjoyed 'orbiting' around the planets as we listened to fascinating information about our solar system.

As we settle into our Reception classes, every day we are getting better at organising ourselves and getting changed for PE and of course have impressed the teachers with all our hard work. Well done Reception!
