Dear Parents

Welcome to the first Newsletter of the New Year! The children have all returned refreshed and enthusiastic for the exciting new challenges and opportunities on offer this term.

Year 2 are knee deep in all things to do with pantomime! In December we took the children to the Playhouse to see a live performance of a pantomime and they have watched extracts of other theatrical performances. Now it is their turn and the whole year group have been cast as parts from the classic tale of Cinderella complete with two Ugly Sisters, a charming Buttons and an Offstage Inspector! The top floor of the school is full of cheering and booing and Year 2 are certainly making us very proud. This is a whistle stop production with performances on 25<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> January and we need to be ready to delight!

In Year 1 the theme is 'Up, Up and Away!' This week the children have been looking at poetry connected with transport including a review of Robert Louis Stevenson's 'From a Railway Carriage' which is one of my favourite poems. This week it is a trip into the woods to Goldilocks' Cottage to think about the three bears. There were bear activities everywhere as well as plenty of porridge oats, in the kitchen, in the art room and even in the garden!

We also found time to get together for our first House Assembly of the year and the children enjoyed colourful flag waving followed by a story from their own House Author as they introduced themselves to other friends in their House and discussed ways to win the coveted House Shield at the end of the year.

Talking of House Authors, we are delighted to be able to focus on one of the newest books written by Julia DONALDSON next week as her book 'Zog and the Flying Doctors' provides the theme for many of the activities on our Air Ambulance Charity Day. I can't wait to see all the costumes connected with the medical profession as well as hear the tales from Dr Matt who is coming specially to see us in his orange flying suit. I felt like Mr Poppy from 'Nativity' last week in the middle of the mounting excitement in the Hall as the thrill of Dr Matt's visit became palpable. Some calming down was required after the assembly when we needed to calmly reassure/disappoint some pupils, that we are not, as was assumed by some, going for a ride in his helicopter!

Congratulations to this week's Lunchtime Superstar Victoria M in Venus class for her wonderful approach at the start of the term for trying lots of new types of food. Well done Victoria!



## Nursery and Pre-Reception News



We have had a fabulous first week back in Nursery. Our topic for this term is 'I wonder what is in the Woods'. The children have been creating a beautiful wood for our indoor role play area. We have been looking closely at different shaped leaves and have used a ranges of mark making tools to create our own leaf to put on display in our role play area. Our focus story this week has been 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears'; we have been learning about the different characters and how they might have been feeling throughout the story and have been busy sorting a range of objects by size. In the garden the children have been making beds for the bears using different construction resources. The children have been using their scissor skills to cut out a range of chairs and were super stars at ordering them from smallest to largest. In the kitchen this week we have been making some delicious porridge, our focus number has been 1. We have measured and added the ingredients independently; we needed 1 cup of oats, 1 cup of milk and 1 spoon of honey. The children enjoyed their porridge on the snack table and ate it quickly before Goldilocks could come along to eat it! What a super exciting week in Nursery I wonder which characters we might find in the woods next week....



## Reception News



This week in Reception we have started spring term off with a baa, a moo and a cluck! Yes, Reception have been exploring our new topic 'On the Farm!' The children have thoroughly enjoyed exploring our 'new' classrooms which are all farm themed (of course). We have a farm shop selling fresh produce as well as a



farm yard complete with animals, welly boots and a bale of hay! In literacy this week we have been focussing on the story 'Farmer Duck' and looking at how unfair the farmer was. We all decided that the animals needed to share the work. The children then showed us lots of the 'caring and sharing' they were doing in Reception. What super stars! After that the children wrote about the duck and what the other characters in the story could be saying to make her feel better. We were very impressed with their letter formation and phonic spelling. Top Job! In maths we have worked hard on developing our new skill of subtraction. We have used the song '5 Little Ducks' to demonstrate to the children 'taking away' with great success and enjoyment too. Some of us could even write the correct number sentence too! The children have enjoyed looking at and digging up all the different vegetables which have had key words written on them. The children liked reading the words before 'planting' them! Another great start to a new term from Reception – keep it up. You are fantastic!
