Nursery and Pre-Reception News



Nursery have had a fabulous week. Our focus story has been the 'Gingerbread Man'; we have listened to different versions of the story and have been helping the teachers with some of the parts we know. We are all super stars at saying 'Run, run as fast as you can, you can't catch me I'm the Gingerbread Man'. Luckily the gingerbread men we baked in the kitchen this week did not get up and run away; they were carefully transported to the snack



table and gobbled up by the...children. We have been very busy thinking about what the characters from the story might be thinking; one of our great ideas is that the gingerbread man might be thinking 'HELP' and the old lady might be thinking 'I am too old to chase you'. In Blue Room this week we have been using our number knowledge and we decorated our gingerbread men with Numicon shapes. We carefully rolled a dice, read the number and then found the Numicon piece we needed; our gingerbread men were very colourful! Outside the children have



been role playing the story of the Gingerbread Man; they joyed being the fox and gobbling up their friends. In Green Room the children have been engineers; they have been trying to save the gingerbread man by constructing bridges to get across the river without needing the fox's help. We had some amazing bridges made from a variety of material even lolly sticks. Wow what a busy week in Nursery.

Our story this week has been 'The Enormous Turnip' we have explored lots of different words to describe the size of the turnip and we have used this descriptive language in our writing as we wrote about what happens in the story. We had some brilliant words such as huge, gigantic, massive, big, small, tiny, mini, teeny. We looked at how we could order by size. We set to work drawing our own turnips and as a class worked together to order



them from biggest to smallest. Once the turnips were all lined up, we tried to use ordinal numbers to describe their position. The biggest turnip was 1st.

Hearing about how the different vegetables and indeed turnips grow, we decided to try growing something in Reception. We wanted something that should grow nice and quickly, so we are trying to grow some grass! We designed mini pots to grow our grass, they look like funny faces,



and we hope the grass will grow to look like some rather cool hair! Once we sowed the seeds we looked to see if there was any change, but we couldn't see anything growing. We realised we must be patient and wait for it to grow. We also had some rather useful plant care suggestions and have decided to leave them in a sunny spot with some gentle watering. We can't wait to check the seed progress next week!
