Dear Parents,

A huge thank you to all parents who were able to join us for our first "Sharing our Learning" this term. It was lovely to see so many of you and I know the children were absolutely delighted to be able to share some of their learning with you.

I was incredibly proud of our Year 2 pupils on Tuesday, as they represented St Christopher's at Bourne Hall for the Remembrance Service. Their rendition of "In Flanders Fields" moved people to tears. We also had a wonderful surprise as Mrs Thackray was also at Bourne Hall and was super impressed with how well Year 2 sang.

Today, the whole school came together for a moment of silence at 11am. The children stood beautifully as a whole school as we remembered those who gave their lives so that we may enjoy peace.

Lest we forget... This week we have been looking at Remembrance Day. We have been asking questions around why we might see people wearing poppies and what poppies represent. We had lots of poppy themed activities for the children to enjoy, including making savoury poppy biscuits. The children were fantastic at spreading the cream cheese and thought they were delicious as they enjoyed them on the snack table. The children were working on their counting and number recognition skills by rolling a dice and printing the corresponding number of poppies using a cotton reel. They also had the chance to get



creative with loose parts, by looking at poppy pictures and creating their own versions. The children did a fantastic job at taking pictures of their poppies using the nursery iPads. The conversations were great, and the children were so creative in their own interpretations. In our green room we were building our very own models of the cenotaph! There children showed great teamwork by working together to make their models, we talked about what the Cenotaph is and where it is found. On Tuesday we thoroughly enjoyed inviting our lovely grownups for a stay and play session, they fully immersed themselves



in the wonderful activities that were on offer. This week the children had the opportunity to make a pair of listening ears, they used their super scissor skills following the lines carefully. The wore their ears during a listening walk around the school, and they heard lots of different sounds from children talking, footsteps on the stairs to leaves blowing in the wind. And finally on Friday we had the opportunity to be a part of the Remembrance Day assembly in which we sang and held a minute's silence.
