Nursery and Pre - Reception News

This week has been full of sparkle as we celebrate all things fireworks!

To ensure we can enjoy the fireworks, we started the week by learning some important firework safety tips. If you are off to enjoy the fireworks over the weekend, you can do so secure in the knowledge that your child will be able to give you some super safety advise! Remember to stand back, don't touch fireworks and always wear gloves when using sparklers. Because we are so good of thinking of others, we even know that it is important to make sure our pets are safe at home so that they don't get too scared. We made posters to share our top safety tips.

In the garden we have been keeping warm around the 'bonfire' with some campfire songs, stories and a delicious hot chocolate! We also made our own sparklers to wave in the air and practise our sky writing. They were rather fiddley to make and we had to follow lots of instructions which involved counting and measuring.

We explored shapes to make some shape rockets and have enjoyed going on shape hunts around the nursery.

We have loved making firework marks, in the glitter we have been making 'whoosh', 'pop' and 'bang' actions and there was some super vocabulary used to describe the crackling sound that the fireworks made. Firework displays have also been created in the art room. What a busy week!

Reception have come back from half term refreshed, excited and ready to learn!

Not only have we had a week full of irresistible learning, but a week full of awe, wonder, noise and ... GLITTER!

As you may have already discovered when your children have returned home with glitter in their hair, bonfire night has been our main theme this week!

In Literacy the children have watched and listened to the different sounds that they can hear at firework displays and have created their own colourful Sparks in the Sky works of art full of magic and sparkle. WHIZZ! POP! BANG! CRACKLE! FIZZ! These are just some of the words that have filled our classroom skies (ceilings) and the children have used their sounds brilliantly to write these words onto labels for their artistic bonfires!

In Mathematics, the boys and girls have looked at finding one more and one less than a given number and are becoming quite the mathematicians in helping the robots with their additions, matching the number sentences to the correct total. Excellent problem solving boys and girls!

The children were amazed at the different shapes that some fireworks can produce so we have also looked at shapes during our learning in Maths! We have even made our own firework shape pictures using numicon, tap a shapes and 2D shapes as stencils! Well done Mars and Neptune on another marvellous week!
