# **Reception News**



This week Reception have been busy looking into 'SPACE' through our book 'Whatever Next' by Jill Murphy. The children were inspired to write about what they would take to the moon. Items such as sweets, sandwiches and chocolate as well as their favourite teddy were mentioned.



We used our knowledge of 2d and 3d shapes to describe and make our rockets. We used language like straight, corners and sides. Some of our children used their imaginations and told us just where their rocket would take them like, Mars, Saturn


and even to have tea with some green aliens.

Linked to our rocket making we practiced counting forwards and backwards from 20! We are all very good at counting forwards and back from 10 but some of the teen numbers are tricky! We practised our subtracting skills too by using a tens frame. We placed counters on the frame and then taking some away. Some of us even tried to write a number sentence too. Well done Reception, you are becoming top mathematicians!



Mars class have been very busy this week acting, dancing, singing and practicing their lines for their assembly. They loved performing to their mums and dads today!
