This week in Nursery we have been enjoying Science week!

We have had the opportunity to blast off in Green room as our focus was Space, I wonder who might want to be an astronaut when they are bigger? We had a blindfold taste test in which the children had to try an item of food and say what they though it tasted like. They did a great job and as you can imagine the salty and sweet flavours were voted the best. Outdoors we got the chance to connect with nature and went on a minibeast hunt, we found a very big spider!

Reception News

Science Week got off to a fantastic start with a special assembly about the Solar System lead by Dan and Sophie who are real-life scientists. Afterwards, they took us onto the playground for an investigation involving fizzy drinks and sweets. The results were explosive! Then, we did a balloon experiment using a wooden skewer covered in olive oil which pierced the balloon. The oil meant the balloon did NOT burst, wow! We also predicted what would happen to Gummy Bears left in water for 24hours and saw the surprising results the next day. On Tuesday, we had an assembly with a man from the local council about recycling, and we did our best to reduce the use of paper and school. We also performed an experiment using fizzy water and raisins, and an



using Skittles sweets. After that, we used invisible ink pens to write kind messages to our friends and opened them up in the dark using ultra-violet light to read what was written. As well as all this, we made skeletons joined with split pins and designed posters for our Science competition.
