### Work of the week



## **Nursery and Pre-Reception News**



What a fun week we have had this week in Nursery. We got to enjoy world book day on Thursday! The children looked fabulous dressed up in their costumes as did the teachers! As our focus was fairy tales for world book day this year, the books we looked at in Nursery included, Goldilocks and The Three Bears, Little Red Riding Hood, Jack and the Beanstalk, The Three Little Pigs, and The Gingerbread Man.

We helped the three bears make porridge in the kitchen this week and got to choose some delicious toppings to go on top. We helped the three little

pigs build their houses in Blue room as well as outdoors with the building blocks and made maps in Green room to find our way from our houses to school, just like little red riding hood when she travelled through the woods to grandma's house. Outdoors we followed the gingerbread man story, we had to try



and cross the river by building a bridge instead of jumping on Mr Foxes back. We helped Jack climb the beanstalk in Yellow room using our fine motor skills to link the beanstalk together. We all really enjoyed reading and listening to the fairy tale stories throughout the week.

The children have been baking with Old Mother Hubbard, making porridge and gingerbread men, weighing and measuring the various ingredients needed and used their senses and amazing adjectives to describe the different smells, tastes and textures.

When Jack or Mrs Grehan, or any special visitors climbs up our beanstalk (the staircase) to reach the giants (Year 2), they will be delighted to read about the marvellous reasons as to why our pupils love to read.
