Black History Month



Black History Month, celebrated in October in the UK, is an important occasion to recognise and celebrate the invaluable contributions of black people to British society. This year, BHM has a particular focus on celebrating and highlighting the successes of Black women in society. We have linked this to our 85th Year Celebrations "Reach for the Stars" and have focused particularly on Black women who have been astronauts, mathematicians for NASA and the British space scientist Dr Maggie Aderin-Pocock. Dr Maggie also presented the CBeebies programme, Stargazing, and has inspired us to "reach for the stars". We have also been reading a fabulous book called "Look up"

about a little girl who dreams of being an astronaut and who inspires us all to look up and see what us is around.

Year One News



This week, Year One have been celebrating Black History Month and learning about Rosa Parks. They have read about Rosa Parks, discussed her life and have been inspired to write about her! In Maths, they have been using natural resources outside, they have explored numbers within 20 and were finding one more and one less than a given number. In art, the children have learnt about light and shade and used this knowledge to make the flames of the sun, a bonfire to decorate paper lanterns.

Year Two News

The children have looked at how to create suspense and tension in their creative writing. They continue to explore how to incorporate the conjunction 'but' into their sentences and are looking at how to use speech marks. In Maths, the tricky concept of subtraction has been taught with children recognising that the key to a successful answer, is in the method they choose. They have been introduced to both multiplication and division and have revisited how to tell the time. The children have also enjoyed using pastels for their Christmas card design in art and have also been involved in rehearsals for our wonderful Harvest Festival next week.

Open Morning

We held a very successful open morning today, welcoming prospective parents to St Christopher's. The children were magnificent in showcasing all that is fabulous about our school and our Head Boy and Girl and Deputy Head Boy and Girl spoke beautifully at the beginning of the day. Year Two gave us a rendition of a song they have been rehearsing for Harvest and we were also treated to piano recitals from our 2 music captains, Jason, and Karen. A huge thank you to the parents who also came along to talk to the prospective parents about St Christopher's.
