Year One News



Nativity rehearsals are in full swing! In Maths, Year One have been working on subtraction using part whole models. They have also been using practical resources to look at Fact Families. The children have had a lot of fun with our practical Science investigations this week. We tested a variety of paper towels to see which was the most absorbent to mop up a spillage. They also investigated the behaviour of different materials, such as what happens when we freeze, tear, or write on different materials. In their Topic lesson Year One have continued with the Great Fire of London looking in detail about the life of Samuel Pepys and his diary. They linked their Art lesson

to science and the four seasons and used collage, parents will receive the finished articles at the end of term as a present!

Year Two News

Year Two have been planning and writing a story inspired by the Mr Benn stories by David McKee. The children had to consider story structure, an intriguing beginning and how their ending could tie back to the beginning. The children continue to develop their understanding of fractions, learning the difference between unit fractions and non-unit fractions. They also learnt how to find fractions of amounts and the importance of looking at the numerator. In Science, Year Two have been learning about natural and man-made materials and investigated different objects and sorted these objects according to their materials, whether they are man-made or natural. In topic lessons, the children have learnt about human geography in Italy and discovered fascinating facts about different Italian cities and recorded these on a mind map.
