#### **Theatre Group**



We were delighted to welcome "Trunk Theatre" to the school on Monday who performed the most amazing show about The Great Fire of London. The performers led the children through the characters and events involved in the story while giving facts and information

#### **Funding raising**

We are thrilled to announce the success of our fundraising efforts, In November, our school contributed a remarkable £280.48 to the Royal British Legion, contributing to a grand total of £4,285.97 raised by Epsom and Ewell schools this year. Additionally, we have received a letter of thanks from the Epsom Medical Equipment Fund thanking our Year Two choir for their carol singing at the Ashley Shopping Centre, which generated £164.36 whilst they were singing. This money will go towards a laser machine in the Outpatient Clinic at Epsom General Hospital.

#### **Year One News**

In Year 1, the children have delved into their new topic of Healthy Eating. In Literacy, the children listened to The Enormous Turnip and then used drama to act out the story. We have also looked at connectives to join sentences together. In Maths, practical resources such as ten frames and part whole models aided their understanding of tens and ones. In Science, we have started the term looking at Winter and exploring winter weather. We have placed rain gauges, wind vanes and used the outdoor thermometer to start a weather diary. In art this week, the children experimented with a variety of media, including charcoal, pastels, and chalk.

#### **Year Two News**

The children enjoyed an interactive workshop about the Fire of London this week. Setting the stage for their new history topic - The Tudors.

Our literacy work has been intertwined with science as we focus on trees, which form the basis of our new text. The children are learning to use new tree-related vocabulary and apostrophes for possession. They have also created their own advertisement inspired by the text.

In Maths, we have focused on using all the strategies and applying this knowledge to word problems. The children have been reminded how useful bar models can be! And of course... Panto rehearsals have begun!

This weeks lunch time superstar is Juliana who complimented the kitchen staff for their delicious lunches.

Our topic this term is 'I wonder how it grows', we will be diving into learning all about how humans, animals and plants grow! And reading some of our favourite stories along the way. This week our focus story has been 'Owl Babies' by Martin Waddell. The children have been talking about how the owl babies might be feeling in the story and how when we are little we need our mummy's and space daddy's to help us with lots of different things. We have loved sharing all the children's beautiful baby photos and guessing who the baby is! Thank you for sharing these with us. In the kitchen this week we have been making some owl baby crackers; the children have been spreading the butter and cutting different fruits to add to their cracker to make an owl and then enjoyed eating them at the snack table. In Yellow room we have been practising counting to 3! The children had to count the owl babies in their nest, and build a bridge over the water for the 3 Billy goats. Our focus book this week was 'The Magic Paintbrush' by Julia Donaldson. This captivating tale, set in China, has inspired us to delve into the wonders of Chinese culture. With magic pens in hand, the children have had a fantastic time drawing and writing about their very own dragons and what their dragons can do. It has been a joy to witness their creativity and enthusiasm! In the story, Shen is a very kind girl who paints everyday objects that come to life to help her friends. This encouraged us to think about how we can be kind and helpful to all our friends, and we even imagined what we might paint for our friends. This weeks focus, in our daily phonics sessions, has been on the digraphs 'ee,' 'oa,' and the trigraph 'igh.' We are amazed at how quickly the children have grasped these new sounds and are beginning to apply them in their reading and writing.
