In literacy this week Year 1 created their own versions of The Enormous Turnip by changing some of the characters and the vegetables. We had some wonderful stories, such as The Gigantic Potato and The Massive Pumpkin. Character changes included astronauts and teachers! In Maths, we have continued to look at place value as well as finding one more and one less on a

number line. In Science, the children have enjoyed completing their weather diaries with a lot of excitement when reading the sub-zero temperatures on the outside thermometer! They also performed an investigation using ice. Their task was to work out the quickest way to melt an ice cube. In Art, we looked at the colour wheel and mixed two or three colours to make another colour.



Year Two News

Year 2 are enjoying our new literacy text 'The House Held Up By Trees'. This text is helping the children learn new vocabulary in addition to seeing how to use conjunctions, adjectives and adverbs can be used in their writing. The book beautifully illuminates the lifecycle of a tree. The children are enjoying learning scientific knowledge and vocabulary through their literacy work. We are building on this theme by encouraging children to create their own individual projects all about trees, with the title 'Are Trees Important?', they are using their research skills to find out if trees are indeed important. This focus on non-fiction is helping children scan contents and glossaries to find information. They are then considering the best way to present their work by using headings, sub-headings, labels, pictures and diagrams., fantastic work Year 2.

In Maths, the children have been applying their 2's,5's and 10's knowledge to worded problems.



Nursery and Pre-Reception News

It's been a chilly, frosty, bitterly cold week in Nursery this week. However, this has lead to lots of fun winter learning in the playground. We had the chance to explore ice and what happens to it when the sun comes out! Since it's been freezing outside this week, we decided to make a delicious winter vegetable soup in the kitchen, which went down a treat. In maths we have been looking at the number 4! We looked at shapes that have four sides and four corners, this lead us to create a lovely piece of artwork in Blue room getting inspiration from the artist Piet Mondrian. The children used squares and rectangles to make wonderful printed pictures. We had our first phonics session this week; our focus sound is 's'. The children have been saying and writing 's' and have made snakes to help them remember their new sound. In addition to phonics we have also had our first group reading sessions in Pre-Reception; the children have been looking at a book with their key group and creating a story together. What an action packed week!









Reception News

In Reception this week, our theme of 'The Magic Paintbrush' by Julia Donaldson has continued. In the story, Shen can paint anything she wants, and it comes to life. We have imagined what we would paint with a brush like that and had some super ideas including, 'a pinc yoonicorn (a pink unicorn), a dinsr (a dinosaur) and 'a byootiful dubl rainbo' (a beautiful double rainbow)! We have also done some Chinese writing, used magic markers, invisible ultraviolet pens and created wax relief watercolour paintings of Chinese style buildings and dragons too.

In Maths, we have revisited the part-part-whole model using different numbers and recorded number sentences to go with them. Plus, we continue to learn new sounds daily and this week made a corn on the cob craft for the 'or' sound, used cars in a phonics car-park to help us remember 'ar' and created glamourous purses for 'ur'. We have also made paper chain dragons and built our very own Great Wall of China in the classroom!

As well as all this, we had a Chinese food tasting. There were noodles with black bean sauce, egg fried rice, prawn crackers with sweet chilli dip and Chinese panda cookies. We were thrilled to see all the children having a try of new foods and talking about there likes and dislikes. It seems the prawn crackers were an absolute favourite.
