### **Neptune Class Assembly**

#### **Year One News**

In Maths, our attention has been on place value. The children have been busy grouping objects into tens and ones while tackling problem-solving tasks. Through hands-on activities, they're developing a deeper understanding of the foundational concepts of mathematics. The children have also been exploring the world of plants, our science lesson revolved around identifying which parts of plants we commonly eat. Mrs Degg's art lesson brought a burst of colour and creativity into our classroom. Inspired by the renowned artist Piet Mondrian, the children delved into creating vibrant acetate art pieces. The children's curiosity, creativity, and willingness to explore new concepts are truly inspiring!

#### **Year Two News**

Year Two have continued their journey into the world of literature with the introduction of a delightful new book titled "Lizzy and the Cloud." This charming story follows a little girl who purchases a pet cloud, sparking the imagination of our children. They explored noun phrases and expanded these while discovering new adjectives such as wispy, jagged, and bustling. The children unleashed their creativity by designing posters advertising a range of wonderful and mysterious clouds for sale.

In art, the children honed their sketching skills by depicting daffodils, paying close attention to proportion and shape. They then used pastels to add vibrant colours, experimenting with blending techniques to create depth and texture to their work. This week in maths, the children applied their times table knowledge to explore division by 2, 5, and 10. They learned new strategies to tackle division problems, strengthening their understanding of mathematical concepts and problem-solving skills.

Year 2 also delved into the concept of a "digital footprint", acting as detectives to uncover information about someone online. This sparked valuable discussions about internet usage, privacy concerns, and the importance of digital responsibility in today's interconnected world.

In Yellow room the children had to take a guess at what fruit they could feel hidden in the tray, the children used great vocabulary to describe the textures they felt, such as spikey, smooth, soft, hard and fuzzy!
