As the days grow longer and the sun shines brighter, our little explorers in Reception have been on a delightful spring adventure. Armed with their trusty checklist, they've scoured the school grounds to confirm that spring has truly arrived. Our garden is beginning to burst with colour and we discovered some bright and cheerful daffodils and found evidence of other bulbs about to spring to life. The trees, too, are waking up from their winter slumber, adorned with tiny buds and beautiful blossoms.

Last week, the choldren planted cress seeds, and the excitement was palpable. Over the weekend, these tiny green wonders sprouted and we couldn't believe how much they had grown. We scarcely needed the magnifying glasses that were set up in our plant observation station! Some curious taste testers couldn't resist sampling the fresh cress right in the classroom!

Our maths focus this week cantered around growth and measurement beginning with their own feet, the children traced around them and measured how many cubes long their feet were. Then, they organised their foot outlines by size—a fun way to explore measurement! Eager to explore greater measures and explore use of different measuring tools, Reception children each crafted their own beanstalks. Once again, we ordered them by length. Finally, outside we combined all the beanstalks to create a ginormous one, which was very long.
