### Year One News

In "arithmetic", we enjoyed some engaging geometry tasks involving right angles, We also had fun playing blow football games using straws and rolled-up foil for the football!

The children have contributed interesting information about life in 2024 to our time capsule, leaving a fascinating snapshot of the present for future generations.

As we near the end of the school year, the children have been busy collating memories and rehearsing songs for our final assembly. It promises to be a memorable and heartwarming event, celebrating all the wonderful moments and achievements of the year.
