#### **Year One News**

This week, Year One explored verbs with the help of Veronica Verb! The children had fun acting out different verbs for their partners to guess. As part of our transport topic, they also made paper aeroplanes, learning the importance of following instructions in order. After writing their own step-

by-step guides, they tested their creations in a thrilling Grand Fly-Off in the playground!

In Maths, the children have been focusing on number bonds and doubles this week, using a variety of

objects to help reinforce these key concepts in a hands-on way.

In Science, the children became little scientists as they investigated the best materials to patch up Winnie-the-Pooh's broken umbrella. Through a fun and practical test, they explored the properties of different materials and discussed which ones where the most suitable.

In our history of transport lessons, we watched clips of the earliest attempts at flight and researched the incredible journey of The Wright Brothers. The children then created a timeline of flight, tracing its development from the first flying machines to modern aeroplanes.

It's been a fantastic week of learning!

#### **Year Two News**

Year Two have had an exciting and productive week! In Maths, they strengthened their understanding of multiples of two, five and ten while taking on the challenge of counting in threes. These skills came to life in problem-solving activities, where they practised grouping and sharing in twos.

In Literacy, creativity flourished as the children crafted poems inspired by a tree-supported house. They skilfully used personification and adverbs to bring their writing to life. A standout line from Alisa captured the beauty of nature's growth: "Slowly but steadily, year by year, the shoots grow into saplings."

Meanwhile, in Science, Year Two is preparing for an exciting investigation! Using eggshells as stand-ins for teeth, they are exploring how different liquids affect enamel. Predictions are already rolling in – Kian even suspects that one egg will completely disintegrate! The experiment begins after half term, so stay tuned for the big reveal!

### **Reception News**

This week in Reception, our superhero focus has been on 'Superworm' by Julia Donaldson. We have been amazed at all the incredible things a little worm can do. Inspired by all things wiggly and wonderful, we explored size ordering with worms, creating our own and comparing their lengths and even taking measurements. Using words like long, short, longer, and shorter, we sorted them accordingly, developing both our mathematical and descriptive skills.

We also put on our scientist hats and made some exciting predictions about what would happen if we left a gummy worm in a pot of water for 24 hours. Using our growing scientific vocabulary, we recorded our ideas in an investigation log. The children thought the worm might fade in colour, shrink, turn the water into a rainbow, or maybe even explode! After patiently waiting, we discovered, to our surprise, that the gummy worms had doubled in size. They had become smooth, sticky, and very squidgy! It was wonderful to hear the children using such fantastic language to describe their findings.

Our creativity didn't stop there. We had great fun gathering ingredients to make magic potions, just like in the story. The children wrote about what their potions could do. To end the half term on a sweet note, we enjoyed making chocolate worm cakes. A deliciously messy treat! Be sure to check book bags for some \*\*special cards\*\*.


