#### **Year One News**

This week the children wrote some fantastic book reviews based on "Clara Button and the Magical Hat Day." They thought carefully about the characters, setting, and plot, and considered which age group the book would appeal to. As a creative follow-up, the children selected their favourite scene and turned it into a comic strip, using speech bubbles and dialogue. Martha particularly impressed us with the detail and thought she put into her work – well done, Martha!

Linking with our topic on clothing, our new text is The Elves and the Shoemaker. The children have made character stick puppets and worked brilliantly in groups to act out the story, bringing it to life through their imaginative performances.

This week's maths focus has been on halves and quarters. The children explored how to find halves and quarters of both shapes and quantities using practical apparatus. Hands-on learning really helped to deepen their understanding.

In Science, our topic was fish. The children examined a variety of fish and labelled a diagram with key features such as gills, fins, scales, tail, mouth, and eye. We also enjoyed watching stunning underwater footage from David Attenborough's Ocean series, which sparked lots of curiosity and discussion.

We've been exploring clothing from around the world. The children had great fun modelling different traditional outfits. A special thank you to Muzhi and Reva, who proudly shared and modelled their beautiful traditional dress with the class – what a lovely way to celebrate our diverse heritage!

#### **Year Two News**

In Maths, the children have been revising their knowledge of fractions, with a particular focus on recognising and finding ¼ and ¾ of amounts. There's been plenty of problem-solving and reasoning too. Rory impressed everyone with his quick method for finding ¼ of 24: "I halved 24 to make 12 and then halved it again to make 6". Very speedy thinking, Rory!

Meanwhile, many children have been working hard on their 2, 5, and 10-times tables. Teachers have been busy quizzing eager learners, and several have proudly earned the coveted bronze badge – awarded personally by Mrs Grehan. She's had a steady stream of enthusiastic Year 2's knocking on her door, and it doesn't look like that's going to slow down any time soon!

In Literacy, the children have been learning how to use paragraphs effectively in their writing. Sebastian took this learning a step further by spotting paragraphs in his reading and confidently explaining why the author used them – what a star!

Finally, with the summer show on the horizon, Year 2 have been enthusiastically rehearsing their lines. There's a real buzz of excitement as scenes begin to take shape and the children prepare for their final performance at St Christopher's. It's shaping up to be truly memorable!


