#### **Year One News**

In Literacy this week, Year One have explored the classic tale The Emperor's new Clothes. After reading the story together, the children enjoyed writing their own imaginative versions. In a fun role-play activity, they took turns interviewing the Emperor himself, challenging his unique fashion choices with some very thoughtful questions!

The focus in Maths was all about money. The children practised identifying different coins and notes, and then had the opportunity to apply their learning in the class shop activity – an excellent opportunity to use real-life maths skills in a fun setting.

In Science, the children asked the important question: Why is it important to care for our planet? The children engaged in thoughtful discussions about pollution, recycling, and ways to protect nature. Putting their ideas into action, they used natural materials to rebuild and improve the class bug hotel.

In Art, the children thoroughly enjoyed working with clay to create their own fish sculptures. After kneading, rolling, and cutting out their designs, they added incredible detail such as textured scales. Next week, they will bring their creations to life with paint – stay tuned to see their fabulous, finished fish!

Last week, the children had the exciting opportunity to visit Juniper Hall, and they've been busy back in class turning their adventures into persuasive brochures to encourage others to visit too. Thanks to the incredible range of activities—shelter building, mammal trapping, pond dipping, and even creating a bug hotel—their writing was full of enthusiasm and vivid detail. With so much to enjoy, it was easy for them to explain just how brilliant the trip really was!

Back in the classroom, Science lessons linked perfectly with the trip as the children explored the life cycle of a frog. They loved learning about the transformation from tadpole to frog and did an excellent job writing about each fascinating stage.

In Maths, the focus was on reading analogue clocks in 5-minute intervals. Although it was a challenging concept, Year 2 showed great determination and made fantastic progress with this important skill.

Art took a fun twist this week as the children used pastels to draw peaches. They experimented with shading, texture, and colour blending to create beautifully soft and detailed artwork.

In their iPad session, creativity and technology came together as the children designed and built a Lego robot tadpole that could move! This exciting activity brought together their knowledge of life cycles with problem-solving and digital skills.



This week, Year 1 have been looking at the story of The Emperor's New Clothes. This is as extract of Luigi's wonderful retelling of the story.
























## **Nursery and Pre-Reception News**
