Watching the tree come to life with the creativity and spirit of each child is a magical moment, and it perfectly captures the essence of Christmas at St Christopher’s!

Year One News

We are almost there! Lines have been learned, dances rehearsed, and songs practised. Please keep encouraging line practice at home and remind your child to listen carefully for their cue before saying their line. We are very excited to welcome our grown-ups to the audience on Tuesday 2nd, Wednesday 3rd, and Thursday 4th December.

In English, we continued our space theme by exploring non-fiction books. We learned the vocabulary *front cover*, *title*, *spine*, *blurb*, *contents page*, *headings*, *page numbers*, *glossary*, and *index*. The children enjoyed going on a classroom “book hunt” to locate these features. Later in the week, we put our retrieval skills into practice by finding answers in the text and “stealing” the evidence.

Phonics

Our new sounds this week were aw (as in *fawn*), au (as in *launch*), ey (as in *monkey*), and oe (as in *tomatoes*).

Maths

We continued developing our addition skills by solving a range of addition problems that don’t follow just one structure. Using manipulatives and real-life examples has really helped the children understand what is happening when we add.

Science

We continued our learning about seasonal changes, focusing on weather. The children noticed that the number of daylight hours becomes shorter as we move into winter. This week’s homework is to complete a weather diary to support this learning.

D&T

We have begun sewing our puppets. The children showed fantastic concentration and fine motor skills as they started stitching their designs together.

Year Two News

This week has been a wonderful one for learning across the curriculum!

In Maths, the children have been confidently revisiting key skills from throughout the term. They have been practising using money in practical contexts — making amounts in different ways and solving real-life problems. We were also particularly impressed with their work on finding three-quarters of shapes and quantities. Using objects and drawings, the children deepened their understanding and showed fantastic determination.

In English, we have been exploring how to build suspense in writing. The children learned how to show a character’s feelings through actions, body language and descriptive hints, rather than simply telling the reader. Using a haunted house as their setting, they imagined their characters stepping inside — heart racing, footsteps echoing — and created some wonderfully tense and atmospheric moments in their stories!

In PSHE, our focus was on “worries.” The children discussed the difference between useful worries — those we can control or influence — and unhelpful worries that are beyond our control. They shared thoughtful examples and spoke sensitively about strategies to manage each type.

We have also been very busy preparing for our upcoming performances. The children have been practising their dance routines with great enthusiasm — lots of energy, big smiles and brilliant teamwork! They have also begun learning the songs for our Nativity and rehearsing the carols they will be singing at the Ashley Centre. It has been lovely hearing their voices fill the classroom each day.

In Art, the children continued decorating their clay birds using colourful tissue paper. The care, creativity and individuality they are showing are shining through — each bird is becoming beautifully unique.

We are incredibly proud of all the learning, effort and joy that has filled our week. The children continue to work extremely hard, and we are proud of every single one of them.
